Peanut Belt Research Station

Lewiston-Woodville, N.C.

The Peanut Belt Research Station focuses on North Carolina's peanut crop. Extensive research is under way at the station with emphasis on peanut breeding, soil fertility, tillage, pesticide interactions and ecology, and management of weeds, insects and diseases. All facets of peanut production are studied, from planting to curing. Other research at the 371-acre station involves corn, cotton, soybeans, sorghum, small grains and certain vegetables.
